I confirm that it will be the policy of this Company in selling sinter or nickel-copper matte pursuant to the Consent Judgment (a) to be willing to enter into negotiations with the rolling mill producer for a license under the above-numbered U. S. Patents authorizing such producer to employ said patents in the conversion of such sinter or nickel-copper matter into metal to be used for the rolling mill producer's production of rolling mill products in the United States, and (b) to impose only reasonable royalties and reasonable con itions in any such license.
