

National Committee for a Free Europe

The **National Committee for a Free Europe**, later known as **Free Europe Committee**, was an <u>anti-</u> <u>communist</u> <u>Central Intelligence Agency</u> (CIA) <u>front organization</u>,^[1] founded on June 1, 1949, in <u>New</u> <u>York City</u>, which worked for the spreading of <u>NATO</u> influence in <u>Eastern Europe</u> and to covertly destabilize <u>Soviet Bloc</u> countries.

History

The committee was founded by <u>Allen Dulles</u>, later to be <u>Director of Central Intelligence</u>, in conjunction with <u>DeWitt Clinton Poole</u>. Early board members included <u>Dwight Eisenhower</u>, <u>Lucius D. Clay</u>, <u>Cecil B.</u> <u>DeMille</u>, <u>Henry Luce</u>, <u>Mark Ethridge</u>, <u>Charles Phelps Taft II</u> and <u>DeWitt Wallace</u>.^{[2][3]} From 1951 to 1952, <u>Charles Douglas Jackson</u> served as its president. The organization created and oversaw the anticommunist broadcast service <u>Radio Free Europe</u>.^[4] CIA subsidies to the Free Europe Committee ended in 1971 which caused restructuring to its operations.^[5]

The Free Europe Committee sent balloons with leaflets from <u>West Germany</u> to the <u>Eastern Bloc</u> countries. Each balloon was able to drop 100,000 leaflets.^[6]
